This Indenture made this 16 day of August in the year of our Lord 1774 Be-
tween Simon Johnson of the county of St^a on the one part & Pettaway Johnson of the
same county of the other part Witnesseth that the said Simon Johnson for and considera-
tion of the sum £60 current money of Virginia to him in hand paid at or about the
sealing of these presents the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge him-
self fully and amply satisfied & paid have bargained sold aliened & by these presents
doth grant bargain & sell unto Pettaway his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract
or parcel of land lying & being in the aforesaid county containing by Estimation fifty
four acres be the same more or less & bound as follows Beginning at a cypress
corner Tree in No Road swamp thence up the various courses of the said swamp to a pine
corner Tree in John Luters line thence a line of marked trees to a pine corner tree in
Collins line thence a line of marked trees to a pine corner tree in Mary Johnsons line in
a small branch thence down the run of the said branch to black Creek thence down
the run of the said creek to a line of marked trees of Rye Turners land thence the
said line to the first station to have and to hold the said plantation tract or parcel
of land unto the said Pettaway Johnson his heirs & assigns forever with
all houses outhouses edifices buildings & yards gardens & all the profits
