This INDENTURE made this 7th day of February in the year of our Lord 1792 Between Henry Branch
Branch & James Wilson Coker & Martha Coker of the one part & Thomas Hart & Wm. Gandy
and Mary his wife James Butts Calthrop & Martha Baker of the other part & Thomas Hart & Wm. Gandy
of the other part Whereas James Wilson Coker became indebted to the late Col^r Richard Kello who was
to Hart & Gandy administrator of Nathaniel Baker deceased for a considerable sum of money and a quantity of tobacco & his
brothers & sisters shares of the tobacco's value of the slaves which descended to him as heir at law
his father the Col^r Richard Kello deceased for purchases made at the sale of the estate for which he gave his bond
to the said Rich^d Kello as a dmt^d with Henry Branch & James Butts Calthrop securities & afterwards
indemnify & save harmless his securities of the S^r James Wilson Coker Mortgag^d to the S^r Henry
Branch & James B. Calthrop a certain tract of land said to contain 425 acres with all its appurtenances
being the whole of the lands then in possession of the said James Wilson Coker the third Col^r Col^r Coker being
unable to pay the debts of the S^r Henry Branch & James B. Calthrop instituted a suit in chancery in
