This Indenture made this 12th day of May in the year of Christ 1794 Between John Clark of the County
of Southampton of the one part & Samuel Kello of the same County of the other part witnesseth that the said
John Clark for the consideration of the sum of fifty seven Pounds Sterling current money of London
deed which the said John Clark doth stand & holds himself indebted to the said Samuel Kello & honestly deserves pay-
and pay to him: And for and in the further consideration of the sum of five Shillings like money
to the said John Clark at this day the sealing & delivery of this the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge
and thereof by every part thereof doth acknowledge & discharge the said Samuel Kello his heirs &
Adams he the said John Clark doth grant bargained sold & confirmed by these presents with
grant bargain sell & confirm to the said Samuel Kello his heirs & assigns forever a lot that plantation
tract of land situate lying being on the North side of Black Creek containing 25 acres
more or less bounded as is described in a deed from the said Sam Kello to the said John Clark & the parties
hereunto before being had to the deed of sale the bounds will more fully appear without the paper
belonging or in any wise appertaining to the premises hereby granted or intended to be granted the
Reversion & Reversions remainder & remainder rents & services benefits of the said lands & premises
and all his right claims interests & securities relating to the same To have & to hold the lands & thereunto
premises unto the said Samuel Kello his heirs & assigns to the only proper use & behoof of the said
Samuel Kello his heirs & assigns forever & the said John Clark doth hereby grant for himself his heirs &
said John Clark for his heirs & every of them shall while warrant of power defend the said plantation tract
of land & the premises & every part & article thereof with all & singular the rights appertaining
to the said Samuel Kello his heirs & assigns forever against him the said John Clark & his heirs
& against every other person whomsoever upon trust nevertheless the said Sam Kello his
executors administrators or assigns shall after the 15th day of December in the year of our Lord 1793 & upon
the said Sam Kello his heirs & assigns admission or a signs shall think proper or the said John Clark shall re-
quest whatsoever of these two circumstances shall first happen / file for the best price that can be got
after giving ten days publick Notice the said lands & premises & out of the money arising from the sale
discharge pay & satisfy to the said Kello his heirs & assigns the above mentioned sum of
£ 67, 10s worth lawful bid thereon from the date hereof until the same shall be fully discharged
& the expenses attending the drawing & recording this Indenture & the contingent charges &
sale as aforesaid & other necessary expenses that shall attend the surveying & dividing the said
mentioned money performing anything that is or shall be necessary relative to the intent of this
indenture and that the said Kello his heirs & assigns shall pay or cause to be paid the sum of money before
to this indenture for the said John Clark & his heirs & assigns to record in writing & publish of this indenture & the same to be witnessed
