 expose the aforesd negro to public sale after the expiration of the above men-
 tioned time & with the money arising therefrom first pay & satisfy the aforesd
 sum of thirteen pounds three shillings 4/2 as also the expenses attending
 the execution of this trust & the surplus if any return to one the aforesd
 Edward Fisher my exors, admors or assigns. In witness whereof I the

This Indenture made this 22 day of December in the year of our last 1794 between Robert Brooke Fletcher of
 Warren county in the State of Georgia for himself and as attorney in fact for Henry Long of Hancock county in the
 State of Georgia and Anne Fletcher of Warren county on the one part and children of George Long Whites of
 Henry Long late of the county of Southampton and State of Virginia and of the one part Samuel Rowe
 of the county of Southampton State of Virginia of the other part Now this Indenture witness full that the said
 Robert Brooke Fletcher for himself and by virtue of a legal power of attorney duly made & executed by
 the aforesaid Henry Long and Anne Fletcher bearing date on or about September last and recorded as
 to be recorded in the court of Southampton aforesaid constituting him the said Fletcher their lawful
 attorney with full power and lawful authority to sell convey all their lands situate & being in the
 county of Southampton aforesaid relation to the said indentment or power being had with one
 John and at large offers for and in consideration of the just full four Twelve pounds ten
 shillings current money of Virginia by the said Samuel Rowe to have in hand paid before the
 the enclosing and delivery of this present the receipt whereof the said Robert Brooke Fletcher
 for himself and as attorney in fact as aforesaid with heavy acknowledge and thereof acquit
 and discharge the said Samuel Rowe his heirs and assigns forever and themselves therewith fully
 fully satisfied and paid they the said Robert B Fletcher for himself and as attorney
 in fact as aforesaid hath granted bargain & sold a line in or full release set over the land and
 the said Samuel Rowe his heirs and assigns forever one moiety or equal half part of tract of land
 and of negro by certain commissioners for that purpose appointed unto the aforesaid George
 Long at his Probation of all the lands of the said Henry Long (decd) reference to the report
