Know all men by these presents that I John Buttle of Southampton county am held and firmly bound
Mary Cottbush of the same county and wife of Anthony Cottbush in the just sum of Two Hundred pounds
current money of Virginia To which payment well and truly to be made should my said Land jointly and
severally be bound with my seal and dated this Twentieth day of December Anno 1794
The Condition of these last Obligation is such that whereas the above bound John Buttle doth agree to sell
the said Mary Cottbush that she shall or may settle on a certain tract or parcel of land lying & being in the parish
county & parish of Nottingham containing fifteen acres more or less and to have quiet possession of the same from
the disturbances of s^d Buttle or any person acting for him during her natural life she is to give with as
much rail timber & wood as she may use of from any part of the land now in possession of s^d Buttle also to
give a good framed house on the said tract or parcel of land Twelve feet by sixteen or as close the first
day of Feb. next and the said tract or parcel of land is to be bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a
White Oak standing on the fork of the Mill branch down the said branch to s^d s^d Cornwell line along
Cornwell line to James Gray's line to the Mill path thence up the Mill path to a Turkey oak & from said
Turkey Oak to the beginning & now if the said John Buttle fully comply with this contract then the above
Obligation to be void or else to remain in full force & virtue

This Indenture made this 11 day of June in the year four Last 1795 Between William
Cucklow of the parish of Nottingham County of Southampton of the one part and Samuel Heat of the same
parish and county of the other part Witness that the said William Cucklow for and in
consideration of the sum of Eighty pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid the receipt whereof
whereof the said William Cucklow doth hereby acknowledge and himself fully and entirely satisfied content
and paid have bargain'd sold Alvin's life of all compound & other Breasts with hereby bargain'd sold
Joseph and compound unto the said Samuel Heat his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of
land lying and being situated in the parish and county aforesaid containing by Estimation one hundred & four
and be the same more or less and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a Black Gum a corner tree on the whole
not branch thence near a Smith Smith west corner to a Pine a corner tree a dividing line Geo Washington's line
and said tract thence binding on Joseph Washington's line to a light colored stump a corner tree thence near
on Geo Washington's line to a small Hickory a corner tree made by the late parties thence a long fence
thence a division on the corner line of the said tract to the head of a small branch thence down the same corner
the sum of said branch to a maple a corner tree on the whole branch thence down the same corner
of the sum of said branch to the first station - Being part of a patent of Lands purchased and conveyed
and sold some formerly granted to Richard Washington bearing date the 16 Dec 1774 and thence by s^d Joseph
by different Properties unto the said William Cucklow to then Breasts come by s^d Joseph of the same
