West Lord & wife Lucy of Southampton county of the one part & Will^m West jun^r of the same county the other part Witnesseth that the said Will^m West Jun^r Lucy in and in consideration of the sum of five pounds to them in hand paid by the said Will^m West jun^r the receipt whereof the s^d William West & wife Lucy doth grant bargain & sell a parcel of land lying & these presents doth grant bargain & sell alias in off & confirm unto the s^d William West jun^r his heirs & assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land containing fifty acres be the same more or less situate lying & being in the county of Southampton on the West side of the Lightwood Swamp & bounded as follows beginning at a black post small West Lord line thence near East to a certain corner lightwood Post thence along the line of the s^d line thence near South to a corner willow oak in or near the s^d line thence a new line of marked trees to the beginning containing fifty acres & all trees wood underwood commons of Pastures Profits commodities advantages Emoluments & hereditaments whatsoever to the said tract or parcel of land above mentioned belonging or in any way appertaining or in or upon the same growing happening or arising & also the reversions & reversioners Remainders & Remainders of the said premises & of every part & parcel thereof and also all the
