

This Indenture made this 5th day of March in the year 1795 Between Arthur Whitehead and Sarah his wife of the county of Southampton of the one part & James Vick of the other part Witnesseth that the said Arthur Whitehead Sarah his wife for the consideration of the sum of eighteen pounds ten shillings Virginia currency to them in hand paid before the enrolling and delivery of these presents by the said James Vick the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge have given granted bargained sold by these presents do give grant bargain sell unto the said James Vick his heirs & assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of land lying & being in the county aforesaid containing by estimation twenty Ares be the same more or less Bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at the Mistle branch at a pine a East course between Council Vicks & Arthur Whitehead a line of marked trees to a black oak a corner tree thence a south course between Wm Beantley and the said Whitehead a line of marked trees to a pine a corner of the S. Beantley land from thence a south course between Silas Vick & the said Whitehead to a black oak a corner from thence a line of new marked trees a west course to the Mistle branch to a bay tree from thence a North course up the said branch to the beginning To have & to hold the said granted land & premises with all the profits privileges conveniences & appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining to him the said James Vick his heirs & assigns forever to him & his only proper use & behoof & the said Arthur Whitehead & Sarah Whitehead doth for ourselves our heirs heirs Executors do covenant & agree that we will warrant & forever defend the right & title of the said tract or parcel of land unto the said James Vick & his heirs & assigns forever against the lawful claims or demands of any Person or persons whatsoever In Witnes whereof we have hereunto set our hands & affixed our seals this day & year aforesaid
