

John Lucas dece his former husband, but before his death did request of his wife the said Elizabeth that she would at his death let the said girl Clarissa return to his family again Now that the said Elizabeth Lucas should have it in her power to carry the request of the said John Lucas dece into effect it is agreed between the parties that the said Elizabeth Lucas shall have a right at any time before her death to dispose of her said writing the said negro girl Clarissa to or amongst the relations of said John Lucas and in any manner she shall choose free & clear of any control of the said Samuel Blunt & the said Samuel Blunt for himself his heirs executors or administrators doth promise & agree to stand to & abide by the above cited agreement This writing is not to be understood as a jointure or in any wise to operate as such but is given & intended only & wholly for the purpose of carrying the request of the said John Lucas into effect In witness whereof the said Samuel Blunt hath hereunto set his hand and affix his seal in the forenoon of the second day of March 1792.

This Indenture made this 12th day of March in the year of our Lord 1789 in the 3rd year of the commonwealth between William Browne of the county of Surrey of the one part & John Pond of Southampton of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Browne for and in consideration of the just & full sum of Sixty one pounds fifteen shillings current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said John Pond the receipt whereof the said William Browne doth hereby acknowledge & thereof doth acquit & discharge the said John Pond his heirs executors & assigns by these presents have granted bargained & sold aliened released & confirmed unto the said John Pond & to his heirs assigns forever a part of that tract of land lying on Round Hill swamp in the parish of Stollaway County of Southampton & bounded as follows Beginning at a Gum standing on Round Hill swamp thence along John Ponds line N^o 12 degrees West 144 poles to the Sandy Branch thence more or less along the various courses of the branch to the mouth from thence the round hill swamp to the beginning containing 63¹/₂ more or less with all ways water courses profits & Interest and appurtenances Reversion & Residues Remainder & Remains with right & title and Interest of the said land every part thereof To have and to hold the said tract
