This Indenture made this 5th day of June in the year of our Lord Christ 1786
Between Richard Blow of the Town of Portsmouth merchant of the one part William
Bittle of the county of Surry of the other part Whereas one Anthony Calthorpe of the county
of Southampton by one certain Indenture bearing date the 16th day of March 1784 and
between the said Anthony Calthorpe of the one part and the said Richard Blow
of the other part sold & conveyed unto the said Richard Blow & his heirs & assigns
one certain plantation tract or parcel of land lying & being in the said county of Southampton
whereon he the said Anthony Calthorpe then dwelt containing 425 acres of land
for securing the payment of several sums of money therein mentioned & for the per-
formance of other covenants therein specified as by the said Indenture duly
recorded in the court of Southampton county relation being thereto had more fully
and at large will appear And whereas in pursuance & agreeable to the trust in the said
indenture mentioned the said Richard Blow hath made sale of the lands in the said
indenture mentioned at public auction to the said William Bittle party heretofore
the sum of one hundred & fifteen pounds being the most that could be got for the same
and after retaining the several sums due & owing from the said Anthony Calthorpe
to the said Richard Blow hath restored the surplus of the money arising from the sale
to the said Anthony agreeable to the covenants contained in the aforesaid Indenture
Now this indenture therefore witnesseth that the said Richard Blow for & in
consideration of the sum of £115.0 current money of Eng^l to him in hand paid by the
William Bittle for the purposes in the before recited indenture mentioned the
amount whereof the said Richard Blow doth hereby acknowledge & hath granted
hath sold aliened released & confirmed by these presents doth grant
convey sell alien release & confirm unto the said William Bittle & his heirs
and assigns forever All that plantation tract or parcel of land & premises with
the appurtenances situate lying & being in the parish of Valloway in the county of
Southampton containing by estimation 425 acres or thereabouts & being
the lands whereon Anthony Calthorpe formerly resided bounded according to the
antient & reputed bounds thereof & all houses outhouses & other buildings upon
