This Indenture made this 21st day of April in the year of our Lord 1795.

Between Benjamin Edwards Browne Esq of the testament & last will of Robert Taylor late of Southampton county died of the one part & James Harris of the said county of the other part Witnesseth that the said Benj^a E. Browne Esq as aforesaid in conformity with the will of his testator Robert Taylor died bearing date the 3^d day of January in the year of our Lord 1789 and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred & fifty pounds ten shillings of good & lawful money of Virginia to him the said Benj^a E. Browne in hand paid by the S^t J^r Harris at the time of the sealing & delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof the said Benjamin & Browne Esq as aforesaid doth hereby acknowledge & think of paym^t part thereof doth Enomate and acquit the said S^t J^r Harris his heirs & assigns and assigns forever by these presents) he the said Benj^a E. Browne Esq as aforesaid hath granted bargain'd sold alien'd & confirm'd by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien & confirm unto the said S^t J^r Harris his heirs & assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land known by the name of Taylors Quarter containing 470 acres (be the same more or less) situate lying & being in the parish of St Luke & county of Southampton aforesaid on the north of the Three Creaks & bounded as followeth Beginning at a Division on the one of the Three Creaks a corner of Philips Joy's land along his line north 74 poles to an Oak a corner of Philips Joy's land along his line south West 110 poles to a Hickory another corner of S^t J^r J^r land thence west 154 poles

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
