This Indenture made the 7<sup>th</sup> day of July 1795 Between Robert H Fisher on the one part & William H Baker on the other part Witnesses that to the said Robert H Fisher for and in consideration of the sum of £200 to him Baker in hand paid at the sealing & delivering of these presents the receipt whereof is annexed doth hereby acknowledge have hereby granted bargained and sold by these & delivered presents doth grant bargain & sell unto the said William H Baker his heirs & assigns one certain tract or parcel of land lying in the county on the west side of Black water river containing 133 acres & 1/2 being the family burying ground containing 400 square feet bounded as follows Beginning at a Hickory on the River bank James Gardners lot & running along the said Is<sup>r</sup> Gardners to a pine on James Gardners lot & running thence along the said Is<sup>r</sup> Gardners line to a small pine & continuing along the said Is<sup>r</sup> Gardners line to Jacob Gardners lot line thence along the said Jacob Gardners line to a small Cypress on the River bank thence up the river
