 sideration of the sum of Fifty pounds current money of Virginia to them in
 hand paid by the said John Gardner before the enrolling & delivery of these
 presents the receipt whereof they the said Jacob Dorton & Martha his wife
 do hereby acknowledge and themselves therewith fully satisfied contented
 and paid have granted bargained sold alien'd Inposse^{ss} & confirmed by these
 presents do grant bargain sell alien Inposse^{ss} & confirm unto the said John
 Gardner Ju^r one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being situate in the county
 of Southampton and on the East side of the Cypress swamp & bounded as follows
 To wit) Beginning at a pine a corner Tree for Mall: Jones's land & John
 Gardners own Land, thence nearly an East direction binding on P. Jones's
 line to a pine a corner tree for James Loggins's land thence another course binding
 on said Loggins's line to a pine a corner tree for a piece of vacant land thence nearly
 a North west direction along a line of marked trees to a post Oak a corner tree stand-
 ing in Henry Gardners line thence binding on said Henry Gardners line to
 Laurence Camm's line in or near the Cypress swamp run thence down the said
 swamp binding on said Camm's line to John Gardners own line thence along said
