 sold aliened enfeoffed & confirmed & by these presents for himself his heirs & assigns  
 doth grant bargain & sell alien enfeoffed & confirmed unto the said Charles Bailie his  
 heirs & assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land containing 295 acres more  
 or less lying & being in the county of Southampton being a tract of land twicedated
