This Indenture Tripartite made this 17th day of July, 1795 Between Littleton
Sholar, James Woodson, Henry Woodson, Bob Winoake, Jimmy Winoake, Tom Turner
Lucy Rogers, Edy Turner, Nanny Woodson, Nanny Webb, Betty, Slip, for ourselves
in behalf of William Gabriell & Nanny Turner, who are a burnt & also for ourselves
half of Solomon Slip, Ann Woodson & Infants of the Nottoway Tribe of Indians
of the first part & James Wilkinson Thomas Vaughan James Miller John T Blow
Thomas Ridley & Robert Goodwyn Gent Trustees as here in after mentioned of the second
part & Miles Cary of the county of Southampton of the third part Witnesseth that
Whereas by an act of General Assembly of Virginia intitled an act concerning the
Nottoway tribe of Indians passed the 12th of November Anno Domini 1792 James
Wilkinson, John T Blow, Thomas Vaughan, James Miller Tho. Ridley & Robert Goodwyn
Gent were appointed Trustees of the said Indians & by the said Act it was rendered
lawfull for the said tribe of Indians under the direction & with the approbation of
the said trustees or any five of them to sell upon twelve months credit a tract of
land lying in said county, which land had been leased to certain persons in the
year 1775 & which lease was about to expire in the year 1793 & upon such sale
the said trustees or any five of them were authorized & empowered to join the said
Indians in conveying the same to the purchaser or purchasers in fee firm.
This Indenture witnesseth that the said Indians & that the said James Wilkinson Tho.
Vaughan, James Miller, John T Blow Tho. Ridley & Robert Goodwyn Gent trustees
aforesaid joining with the said Indians for and in consideration of the sum of 1265
four shillings to be paid to the said Trustees or their successors by the said Miles Cary for
the payment whereof the said Cary has given bond ^{with} good security Pursuant to the
above recited act have bargained & sold a land & confirmed by these presents do bargain
& sell a land & confirm unto the said Miles Cary this Lewis & Rogers former one tract or
parcel of land being a part of the said tract mentioned in the above recited act containing
by estimation four hundred acres & the bounds the same as they were when the land
was leased out to Edwin Gray in the year Beginning at a red oak standing in
Taylors (now Browns) mile hill thence East 162 poles to a Hickory thence South 53
degrees East 95 poles to a Hickory in John T Blow (formerly Henry Taylors) line
thence by the said Blow line to the line of the Indian Fishing place thence up
the line of the said Fishing place to Nottoway River thence up the said river to
the Mouth of Buckhorn swamp thence up the edge of the low grounds of the said
swamp on the west side opposite the beginning and thence across the said swamp
to the beginning together with the profits & advantages hereunto in any part pertaining
whatsoever to the said tract or parcel of land in any way belonging To have and
to hold the said tract of land to the said Miles Cary to him & his heirs forever
said Indians for themselves & their posterity the said tract of land & premises against
themselves & their posterity & against all and every other person & persons who
ever to the said Miles Cary this Lewis & Rogers by these presents do & shall warrant and
forever defend the said tract of land & premises against the
