

Indian & This Indenture Tripartite made this 17<sup>th</sup> day of July 1795 Between Littleton  
 Testator Scholar, James Woodson, Henry Woodson, Bob Wimooake, Jimmy Wimooake, Tom Turner  
 Lucy Rogers, Edy Turner, Nanny Woodson, Nanny Watt, Betty Step, for ourselves  
 while in. in behalf of William Gabrell & Nanny Turner, who are about 6 also for ourselves  
 Half of Solomon Step, Ann Woodson & Infants of the Notaway Tribe of Indians  
 17<sup>th</sup> 1795 of the first part & James Wilkinson Thomas Vaughan James Miller John T Blow  
 Thomas Ristley & Robert Goodwyn Gent Trustees as hereinafter mentioned of the said  
 part of Miles Bay of the county of Southampton of the third part whereof that  
 Whereas by an act of General Assembly of Virginia intituled an act concerning the  
 Notaway tribe of Indians passed the 12<sup>th</sup> November anno Domini 1792 James  
 Wilkinson, John T Blow, Thomas Vaughan, James Miller Thos Redley & Robert Goodwyn  
 Gent were appointed Trustees of the said Indians by the said Act it was rendered  
 lawfull for the said tribe of Indians under the direction & with the approbation of  
 the said Trustees or any five of them to sell upon twelve months credit a tract of  
 land lying in said county which land had been leased to certain persons in the  
 year 1775 & which lease was about to expire in the year 1793 & upon such sale  
 the said Trustees or any five of them were authorized & empowered to give the said  
 Indians in conveying the same to the purchasers or purchasers in the manner  
 this Indenture witnesseth that the said Indians & that the S. J. Wilkinson &  
 Vaughan, Jas Miller, John T Blow Thos Redley & Robert Goodwyn Gent trustees  
 aforesaid joining with the said Indians for and in consideration of the sum of 265  
 four shillings to be paid to the said Trustees or their successors by the said Miles Bay &  
 the payment whereof the said Bay has given bond & covenant to the said  
 above recited act have bargained & sold a land & confirmed by these presents do bargain  
 & sell also & confirm unto the said Miles Bay & his heirs & assigns forever one tract or  
 parcel of land being a part of the said tract mentioned in the above recited act containing  
 by estimation four hundred acres & the bounds the same as they were when the land  
 was leased out to Edwin Gray in the year Beginning at a red oak standing in  
 Taylors (now Brown's) mile hole thence East 162 rods to a Hickory thence just 23  
 degrees East 95 rods to a Hickory in John T Blow's formerly Henry Taylor's line  
 thence by the said Blow's line to the line of the Indian Fishing place thence up  
 the line of the said Fishing place to Notaway River thence up the said river to  
 the mouth of Buckhorn swamp thence up the edge of the low ground to the said  
 swamp on the west side opposite the beginning and thence across the said swamp  
 to the beginning together with all profits & advantages hereditaments & appurtenances  
 whatever to the said tract or parcel of land in any wise belonging To have and  
 to hold the said tract of land to the said Miles Bay to him his heirs forever the  
 said Indians for themselves & their posterity the said tract of land & premises  
 against themselves & their posterity & against all and every other person & persons  
 ever to the said Miles Bay & his heirs by these presents do & shall warrant and  
 forever defend to the Trustees the said tract of land & premises against whomsoever
