 Drew doth further agree that in case he should die or that he should
 sell the aforesaid Agg or her two children then the said Abraham Browne
 is to be free to all intents & purposes as although this writing had never

 sents do bargain sell assign transfer make over and deliver unto the said
 Samuel Browne his heirs &c. all my part or share of the lands lying on the
 South side of Nottoway River except a certain tract called Woodards Joy
 and being in the county of Southampton which may be my inheritance
 from my dead father the late Doct Samuel Browne & the Commission
 inform will be the Sett call'd the Folly with the Side annex'd & then re-
 port to the Worshipful court of Southampton will more fully describe
