This Indenture, made this 14th day of October Anno Dom. 1796 between Edwin Gray James Wilkinson Samuel Wells Benjamin Blunt Thos Ridley Benjamin Ruffin Robert Goodwyn and John Taylor gentlemen trustees as herein after mentioned of the one part and John Crichtlow of the county of Southampton of the other part witnesseth that whereas an act of the General assembly of Virginia passed december the seventh one thousand seven hundred and ninety one entitled an act to establish certain Towns, and for other purposes hath enacted that ten acres of land adjoining the court house of the county of Southampton, the property of Joseph & William Scott, should be and ^{is} thereby vested in Edwin Gray, James Wilkinson Samuel Wells Benjamin Blunt Thomas Ridley Benjamin Ruffin
