The commonwealth of Virginia to John Simmens and William Edmunds Gentlemen justices of the peace of Southampton county greeting whereas Amos Hales James Meacom & Patience Leacom his wife by their certain indenture of bargain and sale bearing date the 28th day of January 1797 have sold and conveyed to Humphrey Drewry all the right title interest claim demand which they or either of them have in a certain tract of land and its appurtenances lying and being in the county of Southampton containing by survey six hundred & seventy four acres And whereas the said Patience cannot conveniently travel to court of our said county to make acknowledgement of the conveyance we do therefore give unto you power to receive the acknowledgement which the said Patience may be willing to make before you of the aforesaid indenture And command you that you go personally to the said Patience and examine her privily and apart from her said husband whether she hath executed the said indenture fully and voluntarily without his persuasion or threats & whether she is willing the same should be recorded in the court of our said county of Southampton and when you receive her acknowledgement & examine her as aforesd that you do here and openly certify us thereof in our said court under your hands and seals returning to us the said indenture and this writ witness Samuel Keeler clerk of our said court at his office the 31st day of January 1797 & in the 21st year of the commonwealth —

Agreable to what was directed we did at the house of Humphrey Drewry on the 31st day of January 1797 personally examine Patience Leacom her said husband and that she did and voluntary relinquish her right to the lands mentioned in the indenture hereto annexed without his persuasion or threats & that the said Patience is willing the same should be committed to record in the county court of Southampton given under our hands & seals the day & year above written

At a court held for the county of Southampton on the 15th day of April 1797 this indenture with the conditions for the trying examination of Patience Leacom wife of Amos Leacom and cooperator of the same to have and to hold the same by the oaths of Harris Johnson John Applewhite Lewis with examination for the examination of Patience Leacom to acknowledge the same being an clause three of the witness thereto and agreed to be recorded
