This Indenture made this 11th day of April one thousand seven hundred
and seventy seven between Henry Taylor of Southampton county of the one part
Mark Nicholson of the same county of the other part witnesseth that the s^r d^r Mr
Taylor for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred pounds eighteen shillings
and pence current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the s^r d^r Mark Nicholson
before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the s^r d^r Henry Taylor
hath acknowledge & thereof acquit and discharge the s^r d^r Mark Nicholson his heirs & assigns
for ever by these presents he the s^r d^r Henry Taylor hath granted bargained sold alied of
these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the s^r d^r Mark Nicholson
his heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land situate lying & being in the town
of Southampton containing by a late survey one hundred & forty three acres & half thereon
as follows to wit Beginning at a hickory on the right side of the road leading from
the place to Cavy's Bridge and runs north thirty three degrees East three chain thence
forty eight degrees east fifteen chain and fifty links to a red oak on the
said road thence with thirty degrees east fourteen chain thence with seven links thence
with eighteen chain thence with twelve degrees West eleven chain thence with
fifteen degrees east nine chain and fifty links to a white oak a corner South
forty seven degrees nine chain to a black gum in a branch thence down the
run of the f^d branch Sixty six chain to three oaks in f^d branch a corner of
Nicholson's land thence along the said Nicholson's line South forty five degrees west seven
chain to a small oak an hawtree in said line thence South Twenty five degrees
west along said line to f^d Nicholson's other corner (three oaks) thence with Twenty
five degrees West Twenty one chain fifty links to the Beginning; Also the tenement and
remains remainder & remainders, tents & surveys thereof with all the Estate
right & title Interest property claim and demand of him the said Henry Taylor
in and to the said land & premises with the appurtenances and of his and to every part
and parcel thereof, To have & to hold the said tract or parcel of land and premises
with appurtenances unto the said Mark Nicholson his heirs & assigns to the only
lessee ever
