Know all men by the presents that I George Williams of Southampton county and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the sum of One hundred pounds lawful money of this Commonwealth to me in hand paid by Solomon Williams of the county and state aforesaid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged I am fully satisfied have bargained sold made over and confirmed unto the aforesaid Solomon Williams and his heirs forever a negro woman named Doffen & girl named Venus and any names for to have and to hold the aforesaid bargain these negroes to the sole proper use and behoof of the aforesaid Solomon Williams and his heirs forever That I the aforesaid George Williams do quit all rights & claims to the said negroes & that the said Solomon Williams and his heirs in peaceable & quiet possession of the same That I the said George Williams do warrant and defend the aforesaid bargain against the lawful claim of any person or persons whatsoever In witness whereunto I the said George Williams have hereunto set my hand & this 15th day of March in the year of our Lord 1797
