Know all men by these presents that I George Williams of the County of Sothm & State of Virginia for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred pounds lawfull money of this Commonwealth to me in hand paid by Charles Williams of the County of North Carolina the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged and myself fully satisfied have Bargained sold by made over and conveyed unto the aforesaid Charles Williams and his heirs forever a Negro Woman named Teo and boy of the name Rego & Girl named Fillis W. All which the aforesaid bargain these Negroes to the only proper use and behoof of the aforesaid Charles Williams and his heirs forever that I the said George Williams do acquit my self of the said Negroes and their increase and do put the sd. Charles Williams and his heirs in peaceable & quiet possession of them that I the said George Williams my heirs and assigns do quit all Right Title to the said Negroes & do warrant and defend the aforesaid Bargain against the lawfull Claims of any person or persons whatsoever as it may hereafter appear I the said George Williams have hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of March in the year of our Lord 1797
