Know all men by these presents that I Samuel Woodard Junior of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia for & in consideration of the sum of Two hundred & one Shillings & six pence to me in hand paid by John Woodard of the same county & State aforesaid have bargained and sold and by these presents doth hereby bargain & sell unto the said John Woodard his heirs and assigns forever the following property one Negro man slave by the name of Bob one ditto Girl by the name of Courney and a small horse purchased by me of Captain Josiah Vick called Jack, to have &c. hold the said property unto the said John Woodard his heirs and assigns forever and I the said Samuel Woodard Junior for myself my heirs &c. and assigns the above recited property doth hereby warrant and defend against the lawful claims of all and every person or persons what soever unto the said John Woodard his heirs and assigns forever In Witness whereof I the said Sam^l Woodard jun^r hath hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this first day of Feb^y 1797
