This Indenture made this 13<sup>th</sup> day of November  
one thousand seven hundred and ninety six, between William  
Magistrate of Southampton in Virginia, of the one part, and  
Henry Dixon of the County of Wake North Carolina of the other  
part, Witnesseth, that for and in Consideration of the sum of six-  
teen pounds, now in hand paid by the above Henry Dixon  
to the said William Magistrate, the receipt whereof the said William  
Magistrate doth hereby acknowledge, hath granted & released, unto the  
above named Henry Dixon and his heirs forever, that tract or  
parcel of Land held in trust from the said Henry Dixon for the  
payment of a sum of money due from the said Henry Dixon  
to the said W<sup>m</sup> Magistrate, and recorded in the Court of Southampton  
May 13<sup>th</sup> 1791, reference being thereto here, with more fully  
appear - Now the said William Magistrate for and in Consideration  
of the above sum, doth for himself, Heirs, Executors  
and Administrators, relinquish & release all claim against  
the said tract of Land, the same as though the above due  
of him, of May 13<sup>th</sup> one thousand seven hundred and ninety  
one, had never been executed. In Witness hereof the said  
William Magistrate, hath hereunto set his hand and affixed  
his Seal, the day & year above written.
