This Indenture made this 7th day of December, in the year of our Lord, one thousand, seven hundred and ninety six, Between Andrew Macmillan, and Molly his wife, of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and Benjamin Morel, Jr. of the other part, Witnessto, that the said Andrew Macmillan, & his wife Molly, for and in Consideration of the sum of ten pounds seventeen shillings and six pence, to him in hand paid, by the said Morel, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged by the said Andrew and his wife, Watto bargained and sold and delivered by these presents to the bargainee, delivered and confirmed, unto the said Benjamin Morel, and his heirs for ever, a certain tract, and parcels of Land containing by estimation Ten Acres & a half, more or less, lying & being in the said County of Southampton, and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a pine in Jacob Clicity line, thence along the said Clicity line to Benjamin Morel's line, leaving
