soever, that may hereafter happen, because or arise, in, about, or
concerning the said debts, or any of them, and we do further declare
that we nor neither of us, either jointly, or individually, will pay
or be chargeable with any such costs, or expences, and on these con-
ditions, we do hereby ratify, and confirm all and whatsoever
our said attorney shall lawfully do, or cause to be done therein
