Be it known to all whom it may concern that I Robert Wills of Southampton County Virginia have this day purchased of Jordan & Joseph Denson, & of Jordan Benson & of Jordan Denson all their, and each & either of their rights & Interest, of and in certain debts, particularly sundry and mentioned in their letter of power of attorney to me, bearing even date with these presents, nor these are to certify that I have received all the papers & documents, which by their agreement, they or either of them, were to furnish me with, and that I am to proceed in & make collection of the said debts at any own Costs, and charges, that no allowance or abatement is to be made from the same stipulated & agreed to be paid them, on account of any failure in collection by means of Insolvency, or any other occasion or pretence whatsoever, except where legal proof of payment is made after the person to whom the payment is alleged to have been made, shall have had reasonable notice to attend, and if he thinks fit to contest the same if then such pretence, payment, or payments, shall be legally established, if against the debt due from Thomas Gray, a cent at the rate of nine shillings in the pound for the amount thereof, and if against any other debt, in the above recited power of attorney mentioned, at the rate of thirteen shillings and nine pence in the pound for the amount thereof, In witness whereof, the said Robert Wills hath hereunto, set his hand this 20th day of August 1796 —
