This Indenture made this thirtieth day of December, in the year of our
 Lord, one thousand, seven hundred, and ninety six, between Robert Wills of the County of
 Southampton and parish of Botolphway of the one part, & Lepe W. Moore of the same
 County, Parish of the other part witnesses, that the said Robert Wills, for an
 Consideration of the just and full sum of two hundred & thirty pounds current
 money of Virginia, by the said Lepe Williams Elmore, to him delivered, the receipt
 whereof the said Robert Wills doth here by acknowledge, and thereof acquit and
 discharge the said Lepe W. Moore, his heirs and assigns forever, and himself there-
 with fully and intirely satisfied, contented & paid, he the said Robert Wills
 hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released, set over, delivered, sold
 & confirmed, and by these presents, doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, release
 set over, deliver, and confirm, unto the said Lepe W. Moore, and to his heirs and
 assigns forever, all that plantation messuage, tract and parcel of land which the
 said Robert Wills purchased of the said Lepe W. Moore, by Indenture bearing
 continuing by estimation, two hundred & ninety five acres, more or less,
 bounded & described as by the aforesaid Lepe Williams deed to the said
 buildings, woods, ways, waters, and water courses, profits, emoluments, her-
 sitaments, & appurtenances, whatsoever to the same belonging or in any
