

Thence with thirteen degrees west, thirty pole to a pine, thene with forty three degrees east, one hundred twenty four pole to a lightwood post, thence south nine ten degrees east fifty pole to a branch, thence south fifty degrees east Twenty six down the said branch, thence to the begining, the said land and every part thereof, to have and to hold, all and singular the aforesaid land, and every part thereof with the appurtenances, unto the said John Pope his heirs and assigns forever, shall also will warrant and forever defend by these presents In witness whereof the said Samuel Edmunds, hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal, the day and year above written —

This indenture made this twentieth day of September in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven, Between Matthew Figues and Lucy Figues his wife, of the County of Southampton and State of North Carolina, of the one part, and William Barrett, Lucy C. Barrett, orphans of Thomas Barrett dec<sup>d</sup> of the other part, of the County and state aforesaid. Witnesseth that the said Matthew Figues & Lucy his wife, for better consideration, of the sum of two hundred thirty pounds, Currre<sup>r</sup> of Virginia, to them in hand paid, by the said William Barrett, Barrett the receipt whereof the said Matthew Figues & Lucy his wife do hereby acknowledge, have granted bargained & sold, and confirmed, unto the said William & Lucy C. Barrett, their heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of Land, situated lying and being

in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, containing three hundred acres by survey, bearing date the seventeenth day of March one thousand seven hundred and eighty six — one hundred and ninety two acres being formerly, but still the residue never before granted, used to be as follows etc. Beginning at a white oak a corner of John Clants, thence along his line, about eighty degrees west seventy six poles to a small persimmon tree, thence south fiftynine degrees west, ninety seven poles to a white oak a corner of South eighteen poles to an Elm, in Hobbs swamp, thence down the run of the said swamp two hundred and forty poles to an ash a corner of Benjamin Hobbs land, thence along his line north seventy three degrees east, one hundred and eighty four poles to a lightwood post, a corner of the late land of Samuel Westbrook jun<sup>r</sup> dec<sup>d</sup>, thence along the line of the said land, with sixty four poles to a dead Oak, thence with sixty three degrees west two hundred poles
