Richard Kees) thence along his line North 22 degrees east to poles to a black oak stump thence North twenty degrees west 24 poles to a pine thence North 29 degrees west 148 poles to a Sapafas, thence along a line of made trees South 39 degrees west 78 poles to a sweet gum in the ready branch, and thence down the run of the said branch to the beginning, and also all buildings, yards, gardens, ways, water, water courses, mills, commodities hereditaments & appurtenances to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining & the executors and execessors, remainde and remitteres, rents, issues & profits thereof, and every part thereof, and all the estate, right, title, interest, possession, property, claim, demand and whatsoever of them the said Arthur Ecum & Elizabeth his wife, of in or to the same or any part thereof, and all dues, recoveries, writings, touchings or in any wise concerning the same, to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances, unto the said Hilles, and to his heirs and assigns, to the only purpose and behoef of the said Samuel Kello his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Arthur Ecum and Elizabeth his wife for themselves, their heirs, executors, & administrators, do covenant promise and grant to and with the said Samuel Kello his heirs and assigns by these presents, that the said Arthur Ecum & his heirs, the said promises with the appurtenances unto the said Samuel Kello, his heirs and assigns, against all due, every person and persons whatsoever lawfully claiming or so claiming the same shall and will warrant and for ever defend by these presents.
