

bouned as follows (to wit) beginning at a persimmon tree standing in William Bryant's line, thence along the said line to a pine a corner tree in the said Bryant's line, thence along the said line to a light wood stump a corner tree thereunto to a red oak standing near the fish pond, thence along a line of marks to the begining; it being part of a patent granted to John Davis to have the said land, premises, thereon or thereunto with appurtenances unto the said Jacob Barrett, his heirs and assigns forever, and also the reversion or reversions, remainder, and remainder of remainders, rents and surveys of all and singular the said premises, and also all the right title, interest, property claim and demands of them the said William Bryant & Edia his wife for themselves, their heirs &c. doth covenant grants and agree to and with the said Jacob Barrett, that the said Jacob Barrett, his heirs, executors &c. shall and lawfully may from henceforth forever hereafter, quietly & peaceably have, hold, occupy, possess and enjoy, the said lands and premises above mentioned sufficiently save and keep himself, of use from all troubles & circumstances whatsoever by them the said William Bryant and Edia his wife, their heirs, executors or administrators, or any other person or persons whatsoever will warrant forever defered. INDENTURE made this 11<sup>th</sup> day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven. Between Thomas Adams of the County of Southampton, of the one part, and Phillip Petty of the said County of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Thomas Adams for and Consideration of the sum of fifteen pounds sixteen shillings current money to him in hand paid by the said Phillip Petty, the receipt whereof the said Thomas Adams doth hereby acknowledge, he the said Thomas Adams hath granted & bargained, sold, aliened and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant bargain sell, alien and confirm unto the said Phillip Petty his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land, lying and being in the County aforesaid, containing by determination of three acres, to the same more or less, and is bounded as follows (to wit)
