 occupy, possess and enjoy, the said land and premises above mentioned and
 sufficiently save and keep him self, of and from all troubles & incumbrances
 whatsoever by them the said William Bryant and Edith his wife, their
 heirs, Executors or Assigns, or any other person or persons whatsoever
 will warrant forever defend. We witnesses whereof the said William Bry-

 ation of the sum of Eighteen pounds sixteen shillings current money to him
 or him paid by the said Phillip Fells, the receipt whereof the said Thomas
 Adams doth hereby acknowledge, he the said Thomas Adams hath granted
 &c. bargained, sold, Aliened and Conferred, and by these presents doth
 grant bargain sell, alien and Confirm unto the said Phillip Fells
 his heirs and Assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land, lying
 and being in the County aforesaid, containing by estimation fifty
 three Acres, be the same more or less, and is bounded as follows (to wit)
