sity, remainders and accretions, rents & profits thereof, and all
the estate, right, title, interest, property, claim, and demand whatsoever of
him the said Thomas Adams of in, and to the said tract or parcel of land
and premises, and every part thereof. To have and to hold, the said
tract or parcel of land and premises before mentioned, and every part and
parcel thereof, with the appurtenances unto the said Philip Pett, his heirs
and assigns forever. To the only proper use and behoof of him the said
Philip Pett, his heirs and assigns forever, and the said Thomas Adams for
himself and his heirs, the said tract or parcel of land and premises, and
every part thereof, against him and his heirs, and against every other person
whatsoever, to the said Philip Pett, his heirs and assigns, shall and will
