




The Commonwealth of Virginia to Edmund Tyler &
 William Hines Gentlemen, greeting. Whereas Benjamin Drew & Polly
 his wife do have by their certain Indenture of Bargain & Sale, dated the 21st day of Octby
 1797, sold & conveyed unto Thomas Wood of the County aforesaid, the fee simple estate
 & all in, one certain plantation tract or parcel of land, lying and being in the
 County of Southampton aforesaid, which the said Drew purchased of James
 Brey & Mary his wife, & the Hines & Polly his wife, containing by estimation
 two hundred & forty three acres, & the same more or less, reserving 50 acres
 part thereof, to and for the use of Hammie Brey & Martha Brey, while they or
 either of them continue single, and whence the said Polly Drew cannot
 conveniently leave to the Court of our said County to make acknowledgment
 of the conveyance of said land. Therefore we command you to go Personally to
 the said Polly Drew, and remove her apart from her husband, sake-
 thuse she hath executed the said Indenture (which is hereto annexed, fully
 and voluntarily, and whether she is willing that the said Deed should be
 recorded in the Court of our County of Southampton, and when you have so-
 annexed her as aforesaid, & taken her acknowledgment of the said Indenture
 that you distinctly certify us therof, under your hands and seals returning
 to us also this date, with the Indenture annexed, witnesseth, Willm & Edm. Clark
 of our said Court at her office the 16th day of November 1797, and in the
 22nd year of the Commonwealth. — teste Edm. Clark

 Lord, one thousand seven hundred and Eighty four. Between Jacob Turner &
 Mary his wife of Southampton County of the one part, and James Finner
 of the County aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Jacob
 Turner & Mary his wife for and in Consideration of the sum of fifty pounds
 English money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said James Finner at
 and before the concluding and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof the said
 Jacob Turner & Mary his wife, doth hereby acknowledge, and therefor doth acquiesce
 the said James Finner his heir & executors and his ministerial agents granted
 his heirs & assigns forever, two tracts or parcels of land, situate lying & being
