This Indenture made this 10th day of October one thousand seven
hundred and ninety seven, between John Beale of the one part, and
Dunwell Beale on the other part, both of Southampton County, Westches.
that the said John Beale for and in consideration of the sum of seventy
Pounds current money of Virginia, hath granted, and by these presents
doth grant and confirm forever unto the said Dunwell Beale his heirs
and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land containing sixty six
Acres, more or less, beginning at a stone in Peacomes line, thence North
sixty four degrees West, one hundred and twenty poles to a pine, thence North
forty three degrees West twelve poles to a pine, thence North seventy six
degrees West forty pole to a pine, thence South thirty degrees East, one hundred
and fifty four pole to a pine, thence North forty five degrees east one hundred
and nine pole to the begining, together with all houses, out houses, gardens
Richards, wares, chattels, and other Conveyances, woods, pastures, mines, minerals
and all other benefits and conveniences thereunto belonging, or in anywise appur-
taining, to land and to lot, the said premises with the appurtenances
unto the said Dunwell Beale his heirs and assigns forever, with the execu-
tions, remanences, and recoveries, rents & issues & profits thereof, and
all and every parcel thereof, and the said John Beale for himself his
heirs, executors, administrators doth covenant and agree with the said
Dunwell Beale, his heirs and assigns, in the following manner that
is to say, that the said John Beale at the time of signing & sealing this
present is lawfully & properly of the said bargaining premises, and that the
same is fully & clearly acquitted, of and delivered manner of incumbrance
or reburden, and that the said John Beale doth hereby warrant & defend
the hereby bargained premises against himself, his heirs to and assigns the
lawful claim of all and every person and persons whatsoever unto the said
land in his heirs and assigns forever. In witness whereof the said John
