This Indenture ^{made} eighteenth day of December in the year of
 our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven Between John
 Guiley and Elizabeth his Wife, of the one part, and Samuel Story of the
 other part, (all of the County of Southampton State of Virginia) Wil-
 McBeth, that the said John Guiley and Elizabeth his wife for and in con-
 sideration of the sum of ninety pounds, current money of Virginia
 to him in hand paid by the said Samuel Story, at his wife the
 signing sealing & delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof
 the said John Guiley and Elizabeth his wife doth hereby acknow-
 ledge, and themselves therewith fully satisfied, Contented & Glad, have
 given, sold, aliened, conveyed & confirmed, and by these presents doth here-
 by bargain sell, Alien, convey, and forever confirm unto the said Saml.
 Story, his heirs and assigns, a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being
 situate in the said County of Southampton and parish of Saint Lukes as join-
 ing, the lands of George Guiley William Thomas & Williams Vicks, bounded
 as follows, Beginning at a tighwood post, a corner of the said George Guiley
 & William Thomas, thence along Thomas's line southerly, to a pine in a
 small branch, thence up the run of the said Branch, to a white oak
 near the head of the said Branch, thence by a new mare line & marked
 trees, across the three Cypress road to a sweet gum sapling in the head of
 a small branch, thence down the run of the said Branch, to a black Gum
