thence northwards by the said Dicks Story's line to a pine in Dicks  
swamp, thence up Dicks swamp to the s<sup>r</sup> George Guileys line, thence  
along the s<sup>r</sup> Guileys line to the beginning, containing by estimation ninety  
acres being the same more or less, together with all houses, out houses, gar-  
dens, orchards, ways, waters, watercourses, ellsings and ellments, and all  
other the property & immovable tenements belonging, or in any wise appertaining  
to have and to hold the said bargained premises with every of the appurte-  
nances unto the said Samuel Story his heirs and assigns forever, with the  
reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues and  
benefits thereof, and every part and parcel thereof. Also the said John  
Guiley & Elizabeth his wife for themselves their heirs & assigns to whom  
with covenant unagreed, bound with the said Samuel Story his heirs  
executors, administrators, that at the time of signing, sealing & delivery  
of these presents, they the said John Guiley and Elizabeth his wife  
having lawfully seized & possessed of, in, and to the s<sup>r</sup> bargain premises  
in a good and peace estate in fee simple, and that the same is fully  
freely, & clearly acquired & discharged of, and from all manner of incum-  
brance whatsoever, and that they the s<sup>r</sup> John Guiley and Sally his wife  
hath a good right and lawfull authority to sell and convey the s<sup>r</sup> bargain  
premises in manner aforesaid, and lastly that they the s<sup>r</sup> John Guiley &  
Elizabeth his, the said bargained premises & every of the appurtenances  
unto the said Samuel Story, his heirs and assigns, shall and will  
warrant and forever defend by these presents in fee simple, against  
the lawful claim of them both, their heirs executors & administrators  
against the lawful claim of all and every person & persons whatsoever and
