 teen pounds, gold and lawful money of Virginia, to them in hand paid
 by the said Samuel Johnson, the receipt whereof they doth hereby acknow-
 ledge, themselves fully and amply satisfied and paid, hath granted, bar-
 gained, sold, aliened, released and confirmed; and by these presents doth grant
 bargain, sell, alien release & confirm, unto the said Samuel Johnson, his
 heirs and assigns forever, all that plantation, tract or parcel of land & premises
 with the appurtenances, now in the tenure, and occupation of the said land
 Johnson, situated, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton.
