And the said Harry Pope, for himself, his heirs executors, administrators and every of them, doth hereby covenant, promise and agree, to and with the said Loran Benson & Joseph Benson their heirs executors, administrators & assigns, that he the said Harry Pope his heirs executors, or administrators, will well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Loran Benson, his heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, the aforesaid sum of three hundred pounds, current money of Virginia, and to the said Joseph Benson, his heirs or assigns, the sum of fifty seven pounds, thirteen shillings & six pence as aforesaid, on or before the first day of January next, with lawful interest thereon, growing due, and upon this special Condition the said Harry Pope, his heirs and assigns, are to repose the said granted promises, Goods, and Chattels, as fully and amply as tho this deed had not been made.
