This Indenture made this sixteenth day of November in the
year of our Lord Christ, One thousand seven hundred and ninety seven
Between William Johnson & Bada his wife of the County of South-
ampton, and state of Virginia of the one part, and Josiah Click of
the same County and state aforesaid of the other part Witness that
the s^d William Johnson, & Bada his wife, for and in consideration of
the sum of two hundred fifty pounds, current money of the state
of Virginia, to them in hand paid by the said Josiah Click, all &
before the signing sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt
whereof the said William Johnson, & Bada his wife, doth hereby acknow-
ledge, and themselves therewith fully satisfied contented & paid, have
bargained, sold, Aliened, enfeoffed & confirmed, and by these presents
doth hereby bargain, sell, Alien, enfeoff, & give a confirm, unto the
said Josiah Click his heirs and assigns, a certain tract, plantation
or parcel of land, lying and being situate in the said County of South-
ampton, and parish of Stottoway in Nagayrun swamp, ad-
joining the lands of William Mullissee, George Washington Wm
Paines, & William Brichlow, and is the same tract of land
the s^d William Johnson purchased of Jacob Paines, containing by
estimation two hundred acres, to the same more or less, bounded as
follows. Beginning at a white oak, in Nagayrun swamp, a corner of
this tract & William Mullissee, thence up the run of the s^d swamp to
a white oak, standing in the swamp, or to a pine, thence bearing
on a line of marked trees, a dividing line of this tract & William
Brichlow to a white oak a corner here, thence Brichlow's line to
a black gum, standing in horsepen swamp, thence across the
said swamp, bearing on Benjamin Johnson's, William Paines's
& William Mullissee's line to the beginning, together with all houses and
houses, gardens, orchards, ways, water, & valuable things, mines & minerals
and accretions the profits & benefits thereof, the whole belonging as in and
wise appertaining, with all the estate, right, title, claim & demand
of them the s^d William Johnson & Bada his wife, if in, and to the same
in any part, a parcel thereof, with the reversion & accretions, remainders
& remainders, rents issues & profits thereof, and every part and parcel
thereof, to have and to hold the s^d bargain & premises, and every part
