This Indenture made this sixteenth day of November in the
year of our Lord Christ, One thousand seven hundred and ninety seven
Between William Johnson & Beda his wife of the County of South-
ampton, a state of Virginia of the one part, and Josiah Click of
the same County and State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that
the said William Johnson & Beda his wife, for and in consideration of
the sum of two hundred & fifty pounds current money of the state
of Virginia, to them now due and to be paid by the said Josiah Click, at &
before the signing sealing and delivery of these presents, whereby
whereof the said William Johnson & Beda his wife, doth hereby acknow-
ledge, and themselves therewith fully satisfied contented paid, have
bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed & Convinced, and by these presents
doth hereby bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, & forever confirm, unto the
said Josiah Click his heirs and assigns, a certain tract, plantation
or parcel of land, lying and being situated in the said County of South-
ampton, and parish of Stowaway in Flaggrynn swamp, ad-
joining the lands of William Elliffee, George Washington, Mr.
Paines, & William Brichlow, and is the same tract of land
the s^r William Johnson purchased of Jacob Paines, containing by
estimation two hundred and forty acres more or less, bounded as
follows. Beginning at a white oak, in flaggrynn swamp, a corner of
this tract & William Elliffee, thence up the run of the s^r's swamp to
a white oak, standing in the swamp, or to a pine, thence binding
on a line of small trees, a dividing line of this tract & William
Brichlow to a white oak a corner tree, thence Brichlow's line to
a black gum, standing in horse pen swamp, thence down the
said swamp bearing on Benjamin Johnson's, William Paines'
& William Elliffee's line to the beginning, together with all houses and
buildings, gardens, orchards, ways, water, water courses, mines, minerals
and all other the profits & conveniences thereunto belonging or in any
wise appertaining with all the estate, rights, titles, claims & demands
of them the s^r William Johnson & Beda his wife, of us. And to the same
in any part or place thereof, or to the revision & recouery, remaining
& remained, notwithstanding the profits thereof, and every part and place
thereof to have and to take the s^r bargained premises, and every part
