This Indenture made this thirteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord, One thousand seven hundred and ninety seven, Between Lepe Johnson of the County of Warr, in the state of North Carolina of the one part, and John Hunley of the County of Southampton, in the state of Virginia of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Lepe Johnson, for and in consideration of the just and full sum of one hundred dollars to him in hand paid, by the said John Hunley, the receipt whereof the said Lepe Johnson doth hereby acknowledge, and thereto acquiesce and discharge the s^d. John Hunley, his heirs and assigns forever, unto himself the receipt fully and entirely satisfied contented and paid; The s^d. Lepe Johnson hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released, set over, delivered & confirmed, and by these presents doth grant bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff, release, set over, deliver & confirm unto the said John Hunley, and to his heirs and assigns forever, all that plantation, meadow tract and parcel of land, which was devised to the said Lepe Johnson by his father John Johnson, by his last Will and testament, situate lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid, in the Cypress swamp, containing by estimation one hundred acres, better or less, and being bounded and described, as by the said said John Johnsons Will, is expressed and declared, and all the houses, out houses, edifices, buildings, woods, coals, waters and water courses, profits, commodities, hereditaments & appurtenances whatsoever, to the same belonging, or in any wise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, accretions, and increments, with issues & profits thereof, and all the estates, rights, title, claim or demands, of him the said Lepe Johnson, of in and to the same, & every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold, the said plantation, meadow tract and parcel of one hundred acres of land and premises, with the appurtenances as aforesaid, unto him the said John Hunley, and to his heirs and assigns forever, to the only proper use and behoof, of him the said John Hunley, his heirs and assigns forever, and the s^d. Lepe Johnson for himself, his heirs and assigns, administrators and assigns, he
