This indenture made this eighteenth day of December
in the year of our Lord, one thousand, seven hundred and ninety seven
between John Castaghen and Peggy his wife, of the County of South
amptons, Parish of Halloway of the one part, and William Raford
of the County and parish aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the
John Castaghen, & Peggy his wife, for and in consideration of the
just and true sum of one hundred pounds, current money of
Virginia by the s^r William Raford, to them in hand paid before the ex-
changing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof they the s^r
John Castaghen & Peggy his wife, doth hereby acknowledge, and
thereof acquit, and discharge the said William Raford, his heirs
and assigns forever, & themselves therewith fully and entirely satisfied
contented & paid, they the said John Castaghen & Peggy his wife hath
granted, bargained, sold, aliened, infested, released & delivered, delivered
confirmed and by these presents, doth grant bargain, sell, alien enfor-
ceable, release, deliver, and confer, unto him the said William Raford
and to his heirs and assigns forever, all that plantation messuage, had
parce of land, situate, lying and being, in the County of Southampton
Parish of Halloway aforesaid wherein John Bone Inn now lies con-
taining by estimation seventy nine & $\frac{1}{2}$ acres, & being all the lands
which the said John Castaghen purchased of Wiley Griffin by his deed
of Survey, bearing date, eighteenth day of December, one thousand
seven hundred and ninety six, being bounded and described, as by the
said deed is expressed and declared, and all the houses, out houses
offices buildings yards, gardens, orchards, woods, vales, water course
water courses, ponds, Cummunity headements, and appurtenances
belonging to the same belonging or in any wise appertaining to
the same, or necessary, remaining and remaining, unto them & their
heirs & assigns, all the estate, right, title, interest claim demand
of them the said John Castaghen & Peggy his wife, of in and to the
same, and every part hereof pertinet thereto. It shall & may be held
the said plantation messuage tract parce of seventy nine & $\frac{1}{2}$ acres
laid and premises with all and every the appurtenances unto
him the said William Raford, and to his heirs and assigns forever
to the only proper use and behoof of him the s^r William Raford
his heirs & assigns forever, and the s^r John Castaghen
& Peggy his wife, for themselves, their heirs & executors
administrators and assigns. The s^r plantation messuage tract
and parce of seventy nine & $\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land, and premises
with all and every the appurtenances aforesaid, unto him
the s^r William Raford, and to his heirs and assigns forever
against whom the s^r John Castaghen & Peggy his wife, and
