The Commonwealth of Virginia to  
Gentlemen Justices of the peace of Anson County & State of North Carolina  
greeting, whereas Elizabeth Kinnick and Susanna his wife, have by their  
certain Indenture, of bargain and Sale, bearing date the 27<sup>th</sup> Day of  
December, 1794, sold and conveyed, unto Benjamin Eney the  
fee simple estate, of and in one hundred <sup>four</sup> Acres of Land, lying and  
being in the aforesaid County of Southampton, and whereas the said  
Susanna cannot conveniently have to the Court of the said County  
of Southampton, to make acknowledgment of the said conveyance;  
Therefore we do give unto you, or any two or more of you  
power to receive the acknowledgment which the said Susanna  
shall be willing to make before you, of the conveyance aforesaid  
contained in the s<sup>d</sup> Indenture, which is hereunto annexed, and  
we do therefore Command you, that you do personally go to the  
said Susanna and receive her acknowledgment, if the same  
and examine her privately and apart from the said Elizabeth  
her husband, whether she doth the same freely & voluntarily  
without his persuasion or threats, and whether she be willing the  
same should be recorded; in the Court of our said County, and  
when you have received her acknowledgment & examined her  
as aforesaid, that you distinctly & openly certify us thereof in  
our said Court, under your hands and seals, & direct them thro  
the said Indenture and this writ witness Samuel Killo Clerk  
of our said Court at his office, the 17<sup>th</sup> Day of February 1795  
in the 19<sup>th</sup> year of our said Colonization
