W^m S^t INDENTURE made this 23rd day of March in the year of our
Lord Christ, one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven, between
Abingdon Jones & Polly his wife of the County of Southampton, a state of
Virginia of the one part, and Matthias Wills of the County of State aforesaid
of the other part, Abingdon Jones, that for and in consideration of the sum of one
hundred Dollars current money of the state of Virginia to the said Abingdon
Jones in hand paid by the said Matthias Wills, at or before the sealing of
delivery of these presents, thereto to whom they doth hereby acknowledge
and therefore doth release, acquit and discharge the said Matthias Wills, his
heirs, executors, and administrators by these presents, they the said Abingdon
Jones & Polly his wife hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened & confirmed, and
by these presents doth grant bargain sell, Alien and Confirm unto the said
Matthias Wills, and his heirs and assigns forever, That part of a certain tract or
parcel of land (or part of half acre lying on the east side of the road leading
to the River Roanoke) land the said Abingdon Jones, bought of Samuel Boone
sen^r who died the same Samuel Boone bought of his son John Boone
lying on the side of Abingdon River, (between the plantation that John
Boone did^r devise to the heirs of his daughter Neddy Taylor & Abingdon
Jones. Beginning at the head of the brook branch or outlet from the main
runn^r of the said branch by the plantation next to Roanoke river, and of
the river to a small stream two stading on the side of the river
and then leaving river and running north-westerly by a row marked
line of trees to a pine standing on the river bank above the plantation
thence up the said river running in the same to the plantation, con-
taining by estimation eighty four or a half acres more or less, and
all houses, buildings ways, water, water courses, profits, corn millings,
headments, and appurtenances, whatsoever to the said premises hereby
granted or in any part thereof belonging or in any way pertaining
to the main and bottom, remains and remains, waters and profits
thereof, and also all the estate right, title, interest, use, have, property claim
and demand whatsoever of them the said Abingdon Jones Polly his wife
