This Indenture made this 29<sup>th</sup> day of March in the year of our  
Lord Christ, one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven, Between  
Abraham Jones & Polly his wife of the County of Southampton, an State of  
Virginia of the one part, and Matthew Mills of the County of State aforesaid  
of the other part, Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of one  
hundred Pounds current money of the State of Virginia, to the said Abraham  
Jones in hand paid by the said Matthew Mills, at or before the sealing of  
delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof they doth hereby acknowledge  
and therefore doth release, acquit and discharge the said Matthew Mills, his  
heirs, executors, and Administrators by these presents, they the said Abraham  
Jones & Polly his wife hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened & confirmed, and  
by these presents doth grant bargain sell, alien and confirm unto the said  
Matthew Mills, and his heirs and assigns forever, That part of a certain tract or  
parcel of land (except one half acre lying on the east side of the road, adjacent  
to the cabin building) that the said Abraham Jones, bought of Samuel Boone  
son of the said Samuel Boone bought of his son Jesse Boone  
lying on the north side of Stoney Run, (between the plantation that Jesse  
Boone did possess to the heirs of his daughter Hedy Taylor & Stoney  
Run. Beginning at the head the broad branch or Gully down the usual  
course of the said branch by the plantation to Stoney river, and of  
Stoney river to a mark & beginning on the side of the wa-  
r and then to leaving river and ascending north westerly by a row mark  
line of trees or pine standing on the river bank above the cabin building  
thence up the said river binding in the same to the pine station, con-  
taining by estimation eighty four & a half Acres more or less, and  
all houses, buildings ways, waters, water courses, profits, commodities  
incumbents, and appurtenances, whatsoever to the said premises hereby  
granted or in any part thereof belonging or in any way appurtenant,  
and the moor and woods, remains and remainments, rents, profits, tithes  
thereof, and also the estate right, title, Interest, use, lives, property, claims  
and demands whatsoever of them the said Abraham Jones & Polly his wife
