self, and his heirs or assigns, not to contract or make sale of any
of the above mentioned property, unless he finds himself likely to
suffer on account of the Countyship aforesaid; and the said
William Coars for himself his heirs, (on this condition)
shall and will warrant and defend the title of the said granted
articles, stock goods & future increase, with all the other granted ar-
ticles, stock goods and Chattels, unto the said William Pope.

the sixteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord, one
thousand seven hundred and ninety eight, and in the 28.

part, Witnesseth, that the s^d Lewis Worrel has and in consideration
of the sum of one hundred pounds, to him in hand paid before
the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof the
said Lewis Worrel doth acknowledge, himself fully satisfied,
hath granted, bargain'd, sold and delivered, and doth by these
presents grant bargain, sell and deliver, unto the s^d Charles Bickson
a certain tract or parcel of land, lying and being in the County
