 at the Creek aforesaid thence up the Meadows of the said Creek
 to the Beginning now the said John in consideration of the
 love and affection which he feels for his sister the said Sarah
 and for and in consideration of the Sum of one hundred Pounds
 to him in hand paid by the said Sarah the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold
 aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth bargain &
 sell alien and confirm unto the said Sarah her heirs and assigns
 forever all his said part or proportion of the said tract of Land
 above mentioned together with all rights and appurtenances
 to his said part or proportion of the said Tract of Land belonging
 or in any wise appertaining and also all the estate right
 title interest and claim whatsoever of him the said John
 of in and to the said tract of Land and all every part and parcel
 thereof To have and to hold the said undivided part and
 proportion of the said Land and all and singular the Premises
 above mentioned with the appurtenances unto the said Sarah
 her heirs and assigns forever and the said John for himself and his heirs
 the said undivided part and proportion of the said Land
 and every part thereof against himself and his heirs shall &
 will warrant and forever Defend by these presents in Testimony
 whereof we the Parties to the presents have hereunto set our
 hands and affixed our Seals the Day and Year above mentioned
