This Indenture made this twenty eighth day of March in
the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight
between John Apperwhite and Rebekah his wife of the one part and
Barney Apperwhite of the other part Witnesses that the said John Apperwhite
and Rebekah his wife for and in consideration of the sum of five Shillings
to them in hand paid the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge they the
said John Apperwhite and Rebekah his wife have granted bargained and
sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Barney
Apperwhite and to his heirs and assigns forever all that Tract or parcel of
Land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton above and is
bounded as follows To wit Beginning at a small white Oak sappling made
a Corner between the said John and Barney Apperwhite on the south side of
the way branch thence up the said branch to a Corners between the
