

This INDEBTURE made this tenth day of August
Christ

in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Ninety eight
between Molly Stephens of the County of Southampton of the one part
and William Boykin of the County aforesaid of the other part witnesseth
that the said Molly Stevenson in consideration of the sum of three
hundred pounds Lawfull money of Virginia to her in hand paid
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained, sold and
delivered, and by these presents doth bargain, sell and deliver unto
the said William Boykin and his heirs, all that tract or parcel of
Land lying in the County of Southampton, on the South side of the
Sea-Cook Swamp and which land the said Molly obtained a
patent for containing by estimation three hundred acres more or less —
Known by its most reputed boundaries being bounded as follows to wit,
by William Boykins line and where the said Boykins line quits the
said land it is bounded by Thomas Stevenson; then by Benjamin
Tunell; then Joel Boykin; then by Arthur Doles; and then by
Capt. Burnell Williamson. To have and to hold the said tract
or parcel of land together with its appurtenances to him the said
William Boykin and his heirs, and the said Molly Stevenson for herself
and her heirs Executors and Administrators, the said tract or parcel of land
with its appurtenances, excepted and secured from all claim or claims
or other incumbrances whatsoever unto him the said William Boykin
his heirs and assigns, against all and every person or persons, so shall
and will forever warrant and defend — In Evidence whereof the said
Molly Stevenson hath hereunto set her hand and seal on the day
