Whether she hath executed the said acca freely and Voluntarily without the persuasion or threat of her S^rhusband? and whether she is willing the said Indenture should be recorded in the Court of our said County? And when you have examined her as aforesaid and taken her acknowledgements of the said Indenture that you distinctly and openly certify us thereof under your hands and returning to us also this writ with the said indenture annexed Witness Sam^l Kello Clerk of our said Court at his office this 16th day of Dec^r 1798 in the 23^d of the Commonwealth.
